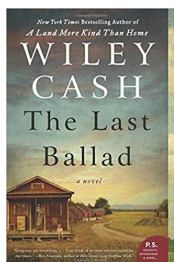


September 10: [My Grandmother Asked Me to Tell You She's Sorry](#) by Fredrik Backman

When Elsa's grandmother dies and leaves behind a series of letters apologizing to people she has wronged, Elsa's greatest adventure begins. Her grandmother's instructions lead her to an apartment building full of strange people, but also to the truth about fairy tales and kingdoms and a grandmother like no other.

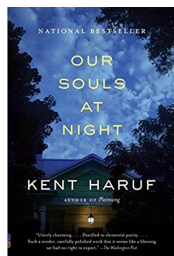


October 1: [The Color Purple](#) by Alice Walker Winner of the Pulitzer Prize and the National Book Award, a PBS Great American Read Top 100 Pick, and included on the Coshocton Public Library Centennial Statue, this is the story of two sisters—one a missionary in Africa and the other a child wife living in the South—who sustain their loyalty to and trust in each other across time, distance, and silence.



November 12: [The Last Ballad](#) by Wiley Cash

Set in the Appalachian foothills of North Carolina in 1929, the story chronicles an ordinary woman's struggle for dignity and her rights in a textile mill. Based on the real life of Ella Mae Wiggins who makes a paltry nine dollars for seventy-two hours of work each week, she yearns for the better life that union organizers promise.



December 3: [Our Souls at Night](#) by Kent Haruf

Addie Moore pays an unexpected visit to a neighbor, Louis Waters. Their spouses died years ago and they have long been living alone—the nights being especially lonely with no one to talk with. But maybe that could change? As Addie and Louis come to know each other better--a beautiful story of second chances unfolds.
